June Visit to Hough Windmill at Swannington:

Tours round the windmill, plus a tour round the site to see evidence of coal mining going back to the 13th century. Doing both "tours" takes around 11/2 hours. We would be split into 2 groups, one doing the windmill while the other does the mining bit, and then swap over.

Re accessibility, visiting the upper storeys of the mill involves climbing about 40 steep stairs. However people with limited mobility can access the ground floor, and there should be a tv screen that displays a slide show of the upper floors. The mining tour involves about a $^{1}/_{2}$ mile walk over grass and rough tracks that could be muddy if wet. Car parking in June will be limited, so if people could car share, that would help.
