

These come from the Charities Commission, to which we are responsible since we are a charity, and from Third Age Trust to which we are affiliated. These have included the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR); a new Safeguarding Policy; a Dispute Resolution Policy: Equality and Diversity: and various Insurance matters and other advice and recommendations for safe running of any organisation. We have no option to ignore these. There is more to come! This is part of modern life and something that we all have to address.



Recently I enrolled on a WEA course, and at our first meeting we were presented with a notice about Safeguarding the Learning Environment and another about Fundamental British Values. It's not just U3A that is having to adjust to new conditions! So we look to you, our members, to support your committee (all of them volunteer members) in this task of implementing such requirements, as they work to guard the ethos of U3A and Life Long Learning.

Dr Eleanor Swan - Visual attention declines in older drivers - impact on hazard detection



Modern Sequence, Folk/Caleigh Dancing. No previous knowledge or skill required.


